One of the key objectives of this initiative, hosted jointly by UNESCO and FILAC, is to reach a shared vision to build a tool for participatory social, cultural and environmental mapping of indigenous peoples whose territories coincide with UNESCO designated sites in LAC, through a rights-based approach.
